Victims and Survivors of child sexual abuse are associated with an increased risk of adverse outcomes in all areas of life, over their lifetime

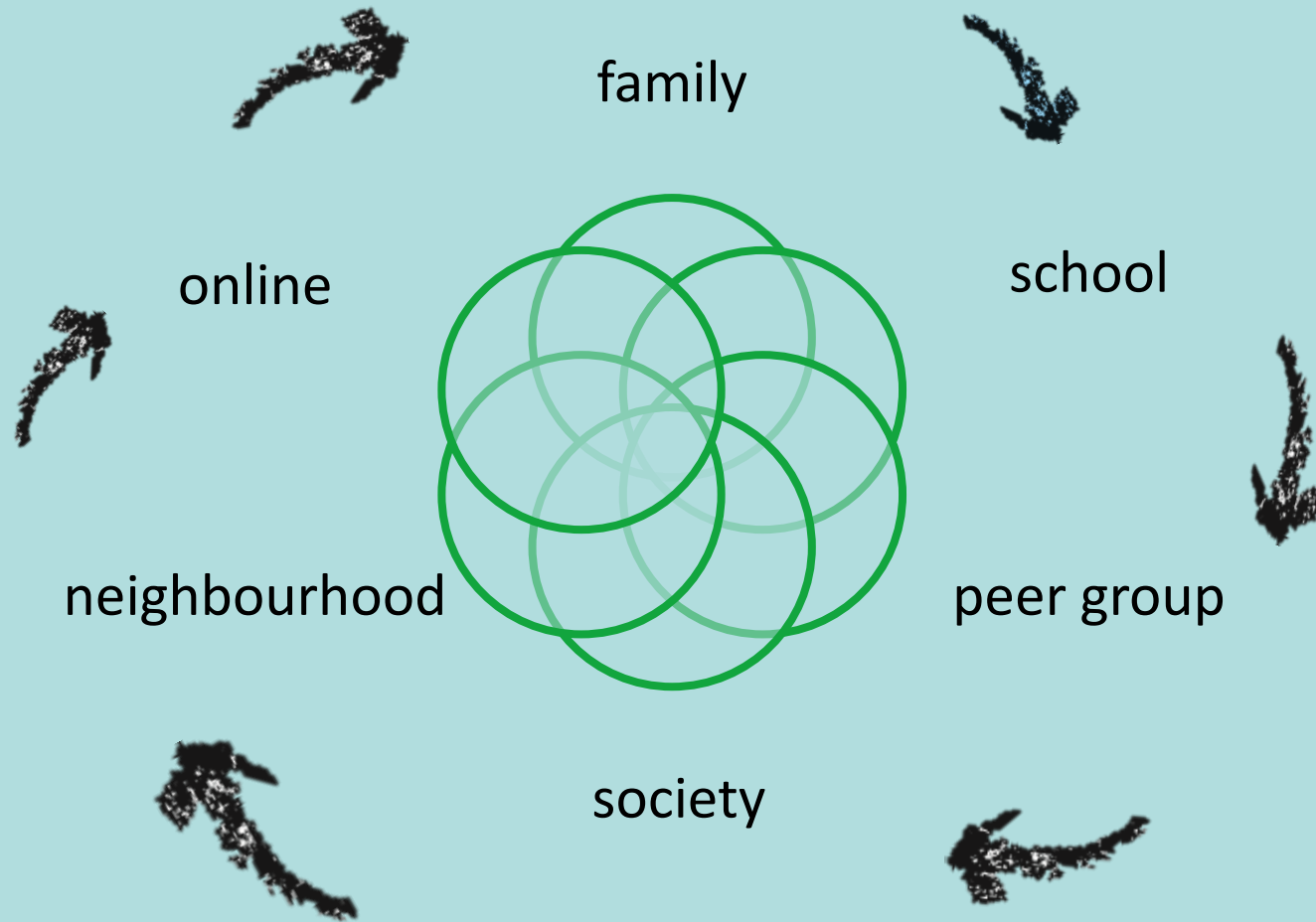
CSA could be affecting 2600 children in Plymouth, but the impact will span across families and communities

Great partnership working and no hesitation that this is the right thing to do

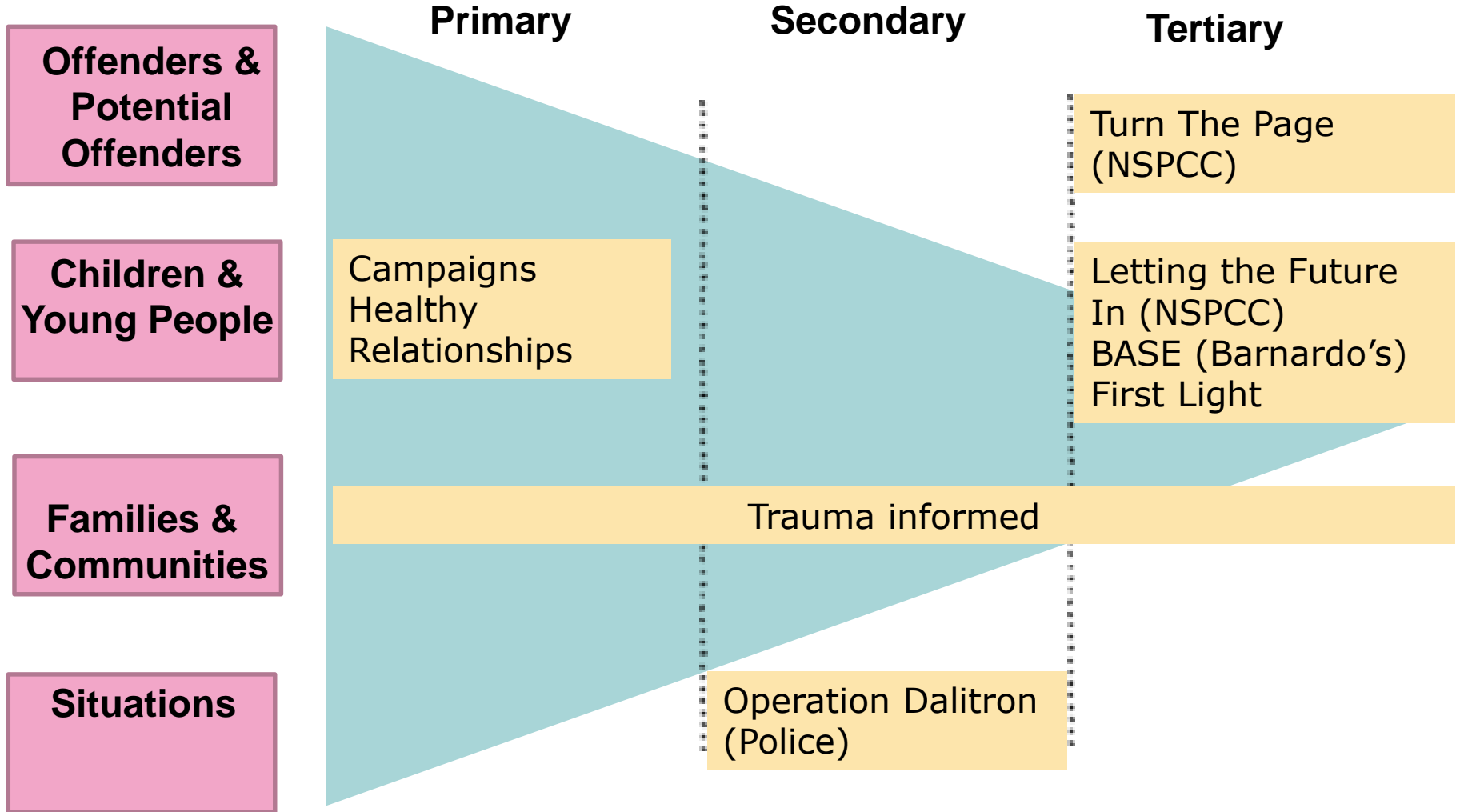
Together for Childhood design approach
